I. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Board of Port Commissioners held its regular meeting in person at the Port administrative offices and via video/teleconference, pursuant to Government Code Section 54953(e). Members of the public participated in the meeting as well as remotely via the Zoom platform or in person at the Port Administrative Offices. Pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act, as amended by AB 361, all votes were by roll call and the meeting was available to the public to attend and provide public comments via audio/video teleconference.

Chair Claire called the meeting to order at 8:00 AM. Clerk of the Board Linda Alvarado conducted a roll call and confirmed a meeting quorum with Commissioners Claire, Dodge, Duncan, Garcia and Kastrop in attendance. Commissioner Duncan led the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES—Regular Meeting of February 9, 2022

B. RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF PORT COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING AN INCREASE IN TARIFF NO. 8. INCLUDING: DOCKAGE, WHARFAGE, DEMURRAGE, STORAGE, SERVICE & FACILITIES, CARGO HANDLING, LINE HANDLING AND MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES

After inviting public comment, Chair Clair confirmed with Executive Director Zortman that there were no members of the public in attendance at the meeting who wished to make public comment on this agenda item. Commissioner Kastrop inquired on the percent change. Harbor Master, Connor Revay stated that staff had benchmarked with other Ports and CAPA. The proposed rate increase is in alignment with other Ports. With the 5% increase, the Port remains underneath and competitive with other Ports.

A motion to adopt the resolution with typographical corrections was made by Commissioner Duncan and was seconded by Commissioner Dodge. The motion passed by a unanimous voice roll call vote of all Commissioners present.

Chair Clair recognized Redwood City's Recreation & Community Services Director, Chris Beth. Mr. Beth presented details of the Fourth of July Celebration that the City of Redwood City (City) will be hosting within a certain area of the Port. Mr. Beth stated a live band will be performing from 7:00-9:15 PM and fireworks will be fired off by Pyro Spectacular from a barge within a safety zone at 9:30 PM. Mr. Beth stated that food trucks and bathroom facilities will be present during the event. Commissioner Kastrop inquired on road closures and exiting pathways. Mr. Beth stated that public notices to tenants will be sent out as well as digital signs will be posted. Chair Claire and Commissioner Garcia congratulated Mr. Beth on the job that he is doing.

Commissioner Kastrop stated that she has received a lot of positive feedback on the concert series.
